Dr. Malone began her nursing career with a bachelor's degree in nursing from the University of Cincinnati in 1970. She combined further study with clinical practice, a master's in psychiatric nursing, and a doctorate in clinical psychology, which she earned in 1981. Her distinguished career has mixed policy, education, administration, and clinical practice. Dr. Malone has worked as a surgical staff nurse, clinical nurse specialist, director of nursing, and assistant administrator of nursing. In 2010, the year she was ranked #29 among the 100 Most Powerful People in Healthcare by Modern Healthcare magazine, Dr. Malone served on the Institute of Medicine's Forum on the Future of Nursing Education, contributing to the IOM's groundbreaking report, "The Future of Nursing: Leading Change, Advancing Health," and on the Advisory Committee on Minority Health, a federal panel established to advise the US Secretary of Health and Human Services.

Barbara Medvec, RN, BSN, MSN, MSA, Barbara is the Senior Vice President, Oakwood Healthcare, Inc. and Chief Nursing Officer, Oakwood Healthcare System. In addition, she also serves on the Oakwood Healthcare System Board and Quality Committee of the Board. She serves as President of the University of Michigan Alumni Board and serves on numerous College Board of Visitors and Advisory groups. 
